Every New Mexican has access to affordable health care coverage through a coordinated and seamless health care system.

Our mission is to ensure that New Mexicans attain their highest level of health by providing whole-person, cost-effective, accessible, and high-quality health care and safety-net services.

WHAT IS THE HCA?

The establishment of the HCA is a significant moment for the state of New Mexico that demonstrates our commitment to prioritizing the health and well-being of every New Mexican. This new state government agency represents a strategic consolidation of efforts to optimize safety-net services, health care purchasing, policy, and regulation under one umbrella.

Effective July 1, 2024, the HCA will operate as a new state government agency, integrating resources and mandates from key entities, including the Human Services Department (HSD), the Employee Benefits Bureau from the General Services Department (GSD), the Health Care Affordability Fund team from the Office of Superintendent of Insurance (OSI), and the Division of Health Improvement and Developmental Disabilities Supports Division from the Department of Health (NMHealth).
