## **Interested Parties:**

The New Mexico Health Care Authority (HCA), Medical Assistance Division (MAD) is providing notice of an upcoming State Plan Amendment (SPA) submission to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS). The SPA, *House Bill (HB) 2- HB2 2025 Rate Increases for Specific Dental Services and Free-Standing Birth Centers*, will incorporate rate changes associated with 2025 House Bill (HB) 2 and HB56, effective January 1, 2026, as described below.

The proposed changes to the Fee-For-Service (FFS) rates specified in this notice are to assure that payments are consistent with efficiency, economy, quality of care, and are sufficient to enlist enough providers at least to the extent that such care and services are available to the general population in the geographic area.

HCA is proposing to implement a 16% rate increase for the top 10 dental codes utilized in pediatric dental services to help build and protect the dental provider health care delivery network. These increases will be effective January 1, 2026.

Additionally, HCA is required to ensure rate parity in accordance with HB56 between hospitals and free-standing birth centers. The methodology for free-standing birth center rates (provider type 405-birth center) has been updated. The reimbursement rate will be developed using the unweighted average base rate and pass-through payment for all New Mexico's labor and delivery hospitals

multiplied by the DRG weight for DRG 795- Non-Complicated Vaginal Birth and DRG 807- Normal Newborn. Below are the updated reimbursement rates on or after January 1, 2026:

A Reproductive Health Fee schedule has been published, which includes the free-standing birth center rates effective January 1, 2026 at <a href="https://www.hca.nm.gov/providers/fee-for-service/">https://www.hca.nm.gov/providers/fee-for-service/</a>.

The estimated financial impact for dental rate increases is \$186,300 in federal funds for FFY26 and \$247,700 in federal funds for FFY27.

The estimated financial impact to update free-standing birth center rate methodology is \$0 in federal funds for FFY26 and \$0 in federal funds for FFY27. Based on Fee-For-Service utilization for Calendar Years 2023 and 2024, there is zero federal budget impact.
