What is it?

The **Senior Food Box Program**, also known as the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), provides monthly nutritious USDA commodity foods to low-income seniors.

To be eligible, you must:

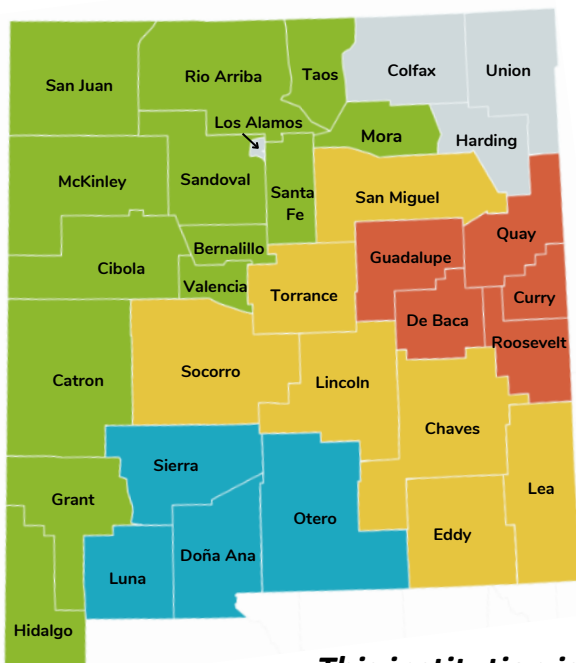
- Be 60 years of age or older
- Meet the income guidelines
- Provide photo ID & proof of age
