

What is it?


The **Senior Food Box Program**, also known as the Commodity Supplemental Food Program (CSFP), provides monthly nutritious USDA commodity foods to low-income seniors.

To be eligible, you must:

- Be 60 years of age or older
- · Meet the income guidelines
- Provide photo ID & proof of age

Who do I contact to apply?

You will apply with the agency that serves the county that you live in. Use the map below to find your agency!
