RE: Tribal Notification to Request Advice and Comments Letter 26-16: Proposed Amendments to 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services, Mi Via Waiver

Dear Tribal Leadership, Indian Health Service, Tribal Health Providers, and Other Interested Parties:

Seeking advice and comments from New Mexico's Indian Nations, Tribes, Pueblos and their health care providers is an important component of the government-to-government relationship with the State of New Mexico. In accordance with the New Mexico Health Care Authority's (HCA's) Tribal Notification to Request Advice and Comments process, this letter is to inform you that HCA, through the Medical Assistance Division (MAD), is accepting written comments until **5:00 p.m., Mountain Time (MT) on September 28, 2026**, regarding proposed amendments to the 1915(c) Home and Community-Based Services (HCBS) Mi Via Waiver (NM.0448.R04).

The HCA is proposing the following amendments to the Mi Via Waiver:

1. Addition of Support Broker Services as a service. Supports Broker Services are being added to ensure that Mi Via participants who do not have guardian, family member, or other natural support available to assist with employer-related functions have access to the support necessary to successfully direct and maintain their waiver services. (Appendix C 1/3, E1, E2, I-2, J2)
2. The term "Employer of Record" was updated to "Supports Broker (voluntary or paid service)" to more accurately reflect the role of the individual assisting the participant with employer-related functions and align with the new Support Broker Services. (Appendix C 1/3, E1, E2, I-2, J2)

Estimated Total Financial Impact

HCA does not anticipate a financial impact.

Tribal Impact

The State anticipates a positive impact to tribal members, participants, families and tribal health care providers as the addition of Support Broker Services expands the opportunities of eligible recipients to choose a self-directed waiver model and receive support necessary to be successful in the Mi Via Waiver program.

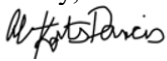
