RE: Unbundling Maternity Global Care

Interested Parties:

The New Mexico Health Care Authority (HCA), Medical Assistance Division (MAD) is providing public notice on its plans to submit a State Plan Amendment (SPA) to the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services (CMS) to align with CMS and American Medical Association (AMA) changes to eliminate all global maternity codes (e.g., 59400, 59510, 59610, 59425–59426) and replace them with an unbundled, phase-based structure. In addition, current delivery only, antepartum, and postpartum codes will be deleted and transitioned to existing E/M codes or newly established maternity codes, effective September 1, 2026.

The estimated total Federal Budget Impact is \$0.00 in federal funds for FFY 2027 and \$0.00 in federal funds for FFY 2028. The shift of global maternity billing to new unbundled billing is budget neutral.
