- Emergency housing for eligible Veterans pending enrollment into another program or move-in to permanent housing as well as Rapid Re-housing and Homelessness Prevention services to eligible Reserve / National Guard Veterans who do not qualify for other programs
- Connections to other programs / services that Veterans may be eligible for
- Dishonorable discharges and discharges by general court-martial are ineligible
